

"The Adelaide Park Lands and City Layout is widely regarded as a masterwork of urban design" – Federal Government National Heritage listing

The Project*

Before the last election the Government proposed an O-Bahn tunnel from Hackney Rd to Rundle Rd, using the existing road network, with no impact on the Park

Now they are proposing a tunnel that comes up in Rymill Park.

Lands.

The tunnel is <u>not under the Park Lands</u>, as many people think – it comes up <u>at the</u> <u>Dequetteville Terrace end of Rymill Park</u>.

The project proposes <u>a new six lane dual-carriage highway</u> built diagonally through Rymill Park: <u>2 bus lanes</u>, <u>2 car lanes</u> and <u>2 lanes for future trams</u>.

The new highway will run within 20 metres of the Rymill Park lake, children's playground and BBQ areas.

Rundle Rd will be closed completely.

The project will cost \$160 million.

Why We Oppose It*

Impact on the Park Lands – including <u>destruction of</u> **Rymill Park** – the 'jewel in the crown' - as we know it

Loss of up to 69 trees – including 19 significant trees

The Park Lands Trail will be blocked by the highway – pedestrians and cyclists will need an alternative route

Major events like <u>Tour Down Under</u> and the <u>Three Day</u> <u>Event</u> will lose their current circuits

Vehicle access in and out of <u>Botanic Park</u>, the <u>Botanic Gardens</u> and the <u>Adelaide Zoo</u> made <u>difficult and dangerous</u> due to dual bus lane crossings

<u>Access issues</u> for Hackney and College Park residents due to <u>the dual Priority Bus Lanes and tunnel on</u> <u>Hackney Road</u>

Increased traffic congestion in Grenfell Street

Significant <u>reduction in car parking</u> in Hackney and the East End, and <u>removal of direct access into Rundle St</u>

<u>Even O-Bahn commuters</u> say they'd prefer that the money was spent on more parking and improved infrastructure at Paradise and Klemzig interchanges
